On September 8, 2017, former Union Minister and chief guest Shri Bandaru Dattatreya of the Indian government launched the National Conference. In his inaugural speech, Shri Dattatreya praised the Marwadi Shiksha Samithi for its outstanding work over the previous 93 years in educating more than 4000 kids annually. In these conferences 10 Articles were presented by Various experts from different colleges around the country Along with citing Swami Vivekananda, he emphasized the necessity of transforming education into a digital process from chalkboards to interactive whiteboards and beyond. The former minister claimed that more than Rs. 10,000 crores had been allocated for digitalization as part of the Digital India Mission. The Conference's proposals will be sent by Shri Dattatreya to the Minister for Human Resource Development, he promised the organizers.

Shri K. Ramachandra Murthy, Joint Director, Dr. DVG Krishna, Director, Shri SB Kabra, Jt. Secretary, and Shri Kamal Narayan Agarwal, President, MSS, had already given welcome speeches. Prof. GD Sharma, President of the Society for Education & Economic Development (SEED) - Indian Colleges Forum (ICF) and

a former Secretary of the UGC, discussed the advancement of humankind throughout the ages in his explanation of the conference's theme. The Internet of Things (IoT), 3D printing, wearable and implantable technology, gesture recognition, big data, robots, and block chain technologies were among the topics he emphasized. Knowledge must be complemented with wisdom, according to Shri PP Shrivastav, a former member of the North Eastern Council, and for this, teacher-student interaction is crucial. The honoree was Dr. Bikas C. Sanyal, a former adviser to the Director-General of UNESCO.

Prof. R. Nageshwar Rao, Dean of the Management Faculty, Osmania University, and Dr. Budhin Gogoi co-chaired the first technical session on the topic of the Impact of the Fourth Industrial Revolution on Higher Education. According to Prof. Nageshwar Rao, while Indians work to enhance technology in developed nations like the USA and UK, our students attend higher education institutions there. This is due to the low quality of the education offered here which leads to Migration of Students. He advised that the amount spent on education per person and the return on that investment be tracked. The value of the National Knowledge Commission in enhancing higher education was discussed by Dr. Gogoi. He emphasized the value of both science and religion in the advancement of humanity.

- Dr. Bikas C Sanyal, former advisor to the Director General of UNESCO and Specially in Higher Education (HE), International Institute for Educational Planning (IIEP), in Paris, was the main speaker. He discussed how technology advancement has affected higher education. In her presentation on the session's theme, Ms. Chandana emphasized the “importance of new educational policies, educational infrastructure, teacher ICT training, and the depletion of creativity brought on by plagiarism”.

A video lecture by technology expert and former PVC at IGNOU, Prof. MM Pant, was played.

Prof. Dwarkanath, HoD, College of Law, OU, presided over the second technical session, which had as its theme "Developing Quality Human Resources With Critical and Analytical Thinking in Response to the Revolution of AI and IoT." He claimed that traditional universities are struggling with a lack of funding and facilities. It is challenging for students in rural areas to follow English classes. Dr. Debashis Kar, co-chair and director of the CDC, emphasised the value of emotional intelligence and human welfare and warned against allowing technology to splinter society.

Keynote speaker Speaking on virtual classrooms, virtual laboratories, Massive Online Open Courses (MOOCs), automation, learning management systems, multimedia, mobile learning, and ubiquitous learning was Prof. Jilani, Director of Distance Education at the University of Hyderabad. He said that the mentor-learner relationship has replaced the traditional teacher-student one.

A paper titled "Role Of The State Of West Bengal In Supporting And Facilitating Institutions Of Higher Education For Meeting New Demands Of The Emerging Changes In Education" was presented by Dr. Sandeep Kumar Paul, Principal, City College Of Commerce & Business Administration, Kolkata. Another paper titled "ICT Enabled Accreditation Process: The Challenges Before Colleges" was presented by Dr.M. Usman, Principal of Amal College of Advanced Studies in Erannhimangad (PO), Nilambur, Malappuram Dt. Kerala (President, Kerala Principals' Council). The relevance of the necessary flexibility in the delivery of the course curriculum was discussed by Prof. P. Purnachandra Rao, former principal of the Indian Institute of Management & Commerce in Hyderabad. He also discussed the usage of audio-visual aids in the teaching of social science topics.

After that, there was group work on the following four themes:

1. Emerging IoT and AI: Opportunities and Challenges

Dr. Bikas Sanyal is the chair; Ms. Chandana Bhattacharya is the co-chair.

2. Chair Dr. B.K. Tyagi, Co-Chair Dr. Ajay Sareen, "Role of Colleges in Harnessing New Technology in Education"

3. The role of the federal, state, and local governments in assisting universities in preparing for new problems
