

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

In higher education 4year multi-disciplinary bachelor's degree in a undergraduate program with multiple exit options like, a certificate after completion of 1 year study, a diploma after 2 year completion of study, a bachelor's degree after 3 year study and a 4 year multi-disciplinary bachelor's degree after 4 year study. The policy also proposes to internationalize education in India, and the fees of both private and public universities will be fixed. The EdTech companies and start-ups are provided with necessary guidelines and to develop learning management systems and numerous new educational institutes, bodies have been given permission to be formed.

The session was very informative especially to the students and faculty to upgrade themselves with the upcoming policy. And the session concluded with vote of thanks and a sapling was presented to the speaker.
