Outcome:





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Green Environment

Planting trees has numerous advantages. Trees serve a crucial part in maintaining the health of our planet in addition to making our surroundings more beautiful. Trees improve air quality by removing pollutants, making the environment cleaner and healthier. According to studies, being around trees and other greenery can reduce stress and enhance mental health. Considering these points, college management and Principals of different departments encouraged staff and students to plant samplings on campus at various events.

Education on the environment is the Core Curriculum introduced by the University, irrespective of any stream for all first-year students. The subject is Environmental Studies, and students need to study the course and write an examination as per university norms. The course aims "to provide a conceptual framework for understanding and analyzing environmental problems." As an individual, one should be able to explain the key ideas and approaches from ecological and physical sciences and apply them to solving environmental problems by the end of the course. Other than these students can know how to deal with the environment on a personal and societal level by critically examining all environmental studies' facets, such as environmental pollution, health concerns, and laws.

Faculty and students participated in the Haritha Haram Programme, a government-sponsored environmental program, and planted trees on and off campus. Several events were also carried out in conjunction with the GHMC to educate children about the benefits of tree planting for a sustainable environment. Every year, the College organizes competitions for its students and lectures by notable individuals to raise awareness of "World Environmental Day" and "International Plantation Day." As part of the green program, saplings are given out to the students, staff, and community.

Regularly, the College holds educational events for students about the dangers of plastic and alternate strategies for reducing its usage. The College takes all necessary steps to keep the campus free of plastic waste and other harmful environmental pollution.

The institution has provided free jute bags to all the staff in order to ban plastic usage. The College decided to go plastic-free on campus resulting in no plastic cups, plastic plates, or spoons on campus. Instead, we use steel or paper glasses, plates, and spoons. We are simply utilizing steel in place of plastic. We organized a "Plastic free zone" to raise community awareness wherein the students and staff are made aware of using paper bags as well as Cloth bags instead of plastic.

Solid Waste Management

Webinar on International Plastic Bag Free Day on 3rd July 2021

We intend to continue our efforts to encourage sustainable practices inside our organisation and expand on this momentum going forward.

Year 2020-21

Every year on June 5th, people all over the world observe World Environment Day to increase awareness of environmental problems and inspire action for change. To support sustainable green practices in 2020, MSS RG KEDIA COLLEGE launched a plant distribution campaign. In this study, the plant distribution programme is described in general terms, with special emphasis on how it has helped to promote environmental awareness.

World Environment Day 2020's plant distribution programme had the following primary goals in mind:

- The need to preserve the environment by increasing awareness of the value of plants.
- Spread the word about the advantages of biodiversity and urban greening.
- To get people involved in sustainable practices, promote them.





To obtain a sufficient quantity of plants, College worked alongside with Leo Club and other environmental organisations. A wide range of healthy plants were made available for distribution thanks to this arrangement.

Participants were given instructional materials, such as planting instructions, maintenance guidelines, and details on the ecological advantages of the plants distributed. People were able to better grasp how their activities could affect the environment as a result.

The College effectively engaged the community,

increased environmental awareness, and helped to green urban areas with its plant distribution programme in honour of World Environment Day 2020. Individuals were given the tools necessary to take an active role in environmental conservation and implement sustainable practices through this effort.



The environmental campaign Harita Haram on 12th September 2020 which translates to "Green Garland," aims to increase greenery and advance ecological sustainability. As part of its dedication to environmental responsibility, Management, Faculty and Non-teachingof MSS R G KEDIA COLLEGE did this admirable project. The college's efforts to undertake Harita Haram are described, along with its effects on the neighbourhood's ecosystem. Students, staff, and volunteers all actively participated in tree planting drives. Teams were

established for the plantation, and each team was in charge of preparing the planting areas, guaranteeing optimum tree spacing, and encouraging tree adoption and upkeep.

The college identified places on its property and nearby that would be good for planting trees. During the site selection process, variables like soil quality, water sources' accessibility, and climate compatibility were taken into account.

To ensure ecosystem diversity, different tree species that are native to the area were selected. Native species were given preference because of their adaptability, rapid growth, and environmental advantages such carbon sequestration and air purification.



Year 2019-20

Awareness campaign to emphasise the value of a healthy diet and general cleanliness was conducted by R



G Kedia College in Collaboration with Kachiguda Government School located at Nimboliadda. Faculty of 3 with 10 Degree students on 4thDecember 2019 took the initiative to go to the school and provide awareness to the students. The campaign's goal was to spread awareness of, and encourage, healthy eating and hygiene practices among students.

Interactive workshops were held separately class wise for students of about 150 to kick off the campaign. A balanced and healthy diet is important for growth, development, and general well-being. Qualified nutritionists and health specialists were asked to give educational presentations on this topic. The lessons focused on the

importance of key nutrients, portion control, and consuming fruits, vegetables, proteins, and whole grains every day.
